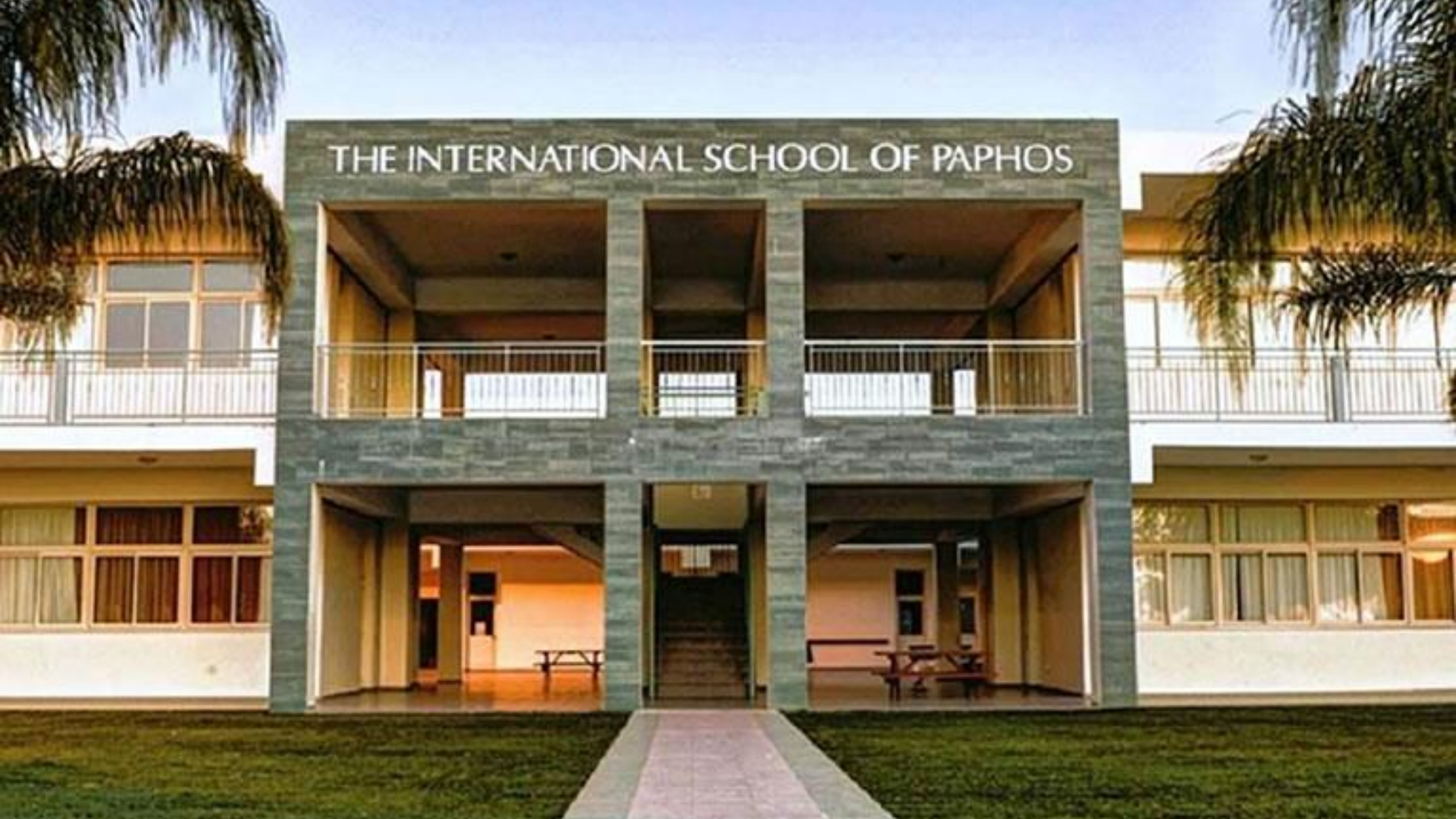

Saturday 27 th March	Earth Hour 20:30 – 21:30 Takes place every year to highlight the problems our planet is facing. All lights are switched off and we turn off electricity for 1 hour. This year it is different, earthhour.org ask that you spotlight our planet by sharing a video from their website on your social media highlighting the issues the planet is facing.		Monday 12 th	<u>Reuse</u> We're sure you have heard this word before, but if not, to reuse means to use again. For example, if we have some old clothes that we don't use, we can give them to charity, so someone can use them again. Or, instead of plastics cups/bottles, we can buy one (maybe with a pretty design 😊) and refill it!
Sunday 28 th March	Don't use your car today. Most people are aware of the effects of the carbon dioxide emissions that contribute to climate change. Do you know that cars are responsible for air, water and soil pollution? They affect human health and can make asthma worse in many. So ditch the car for a day and see if you can walk, bike or use public transport instead.		Tuesday 13 th	Measure your carbon footprint (try Footprint.wwf.org.uk, or another site). Your carbon footprint is an estimate of how much you impact on the planet. It is a measure of your lifestyle, your travelling, your shopping etc. see if the world can afford to support you
Monday 29 th March	Start your recycling competition entry. We challenge you to think of a new way of using a plastic water bottle (or many). There are so many in Cyprus and in our school so how can we reuse them? Choose any size bottle, give it a new use and let us know via Teams, email or bring it in to school. Make sure we have your name and form group too.		Wednesday 14 th	<u>Clean the school area #pollutionpatrolcy</u> If we all believe then we can make a difference. Pick up some litter, if everyone does then who knows how much cleaner and better the environment will be. #pollutionpatrolcy is a group who try to make a difference, lets join them to make a bigger difference
Tuesday 30 th March	Reduce your water consumption (not how much you drink!) Although 71% of the planet is water, only 0.3% is drinkable. There is a shortage of this water and most of it is used in agriculture and then for generating electricity. Water stress is when a country, like Cyprus, uses more water at some times than it collects. Try taking a shorter shower, or re-using the water you wash up in to water a plant!		Thursday 15 th	<u>Eco sale in school</u> join us in buying Eco-friendly products to help reduce and reuse things. Fair trade chocolate (Fairtrade changes trade for better prices, decent working conditions and a fairer deal for farmers and workers), olive oil soap, plants, herbs, reusable bags.
Wednesday 31 st March	Eat fruit for a day – Many of the fruits we eat come from trees and so by increasing our fruit intake and demand we will push for more trees to be planted. There are many other impacts on increasing our fruit intake and decreasing our meat consumption, all good for the environment. In Cyprus we are lucky to have a wide variety of seasonal fruits available. let's try them!		Friday 16 th	<u>Why should we reduce our carbon dioxide pollution, presentation by Andreas Tavros</u>
			Saturday 17 th	<u>Buy locally sourced products, including food</u> Transportation of goods is one of the biggest contributors to air pollution, including acid rain. The more we can buy locally the less impact there is on the environment
			Sunday 18 th	<u>Make a compost bin</u> food waste should be minimised (on average 30% of food is wasted) to reduce your consumption, but some waste is going to happen. Make a compost bin (https://www.diyncrafts.com/33618/home/gardening/35-cheap-easy-diy-compost-bins-can-build-weekend) to allow this to breakdown so you have better soil for your garden.
			Monday 19 th	<u>Recycle, bring your old oil to school</u> waste cooking oil contaminates water ways. It can be used as fuel for trucks and cars (don't put it in your car unless it has been converted). Bring your oil to school on
